## TOURIST ATTRACTIONS:

### NOBORIBETSU

- ◆ **Noboribetsu Date Jidaimura** - A history theme park highlighting the Edo Period, one of the most attractive era in Japanese history. Step back in time to enjoy traditional games, activities, theaters, street performances and more. The charm of ancient Japan is abundant as you mingle with the Ninja and Oiran courtesans so symbolic of the Edo Period.
- ◆ **Noboribetsu Jigokudani** - Is a spectacular, appropriately named valley just above the town of Noboribetsu Onsen, which displays hot steam vents, sulfurous streams and other volcanic activity.
- ◆ **Mt. Showa-Shinzan** - Literally means 'Showa new mountain,' as it formed during the reign of Emperor Hirohito, known as the Showa period.
- ◆ **Marine Park Nixe** - Is a popular theme park focusing on fish, marine mammals, sea creatures and some other animals. More attractions include a touch pool with small sharks, rays, and horseshoe crabs; a reptile house with snakes, turtles and lizards. You may also have fun activities and small events like the Parade of the king penguins (Subject to weather conditions).

### OTARU

- ◆ **Otaru Canal** - Rows of old warehouse built of stone stand along the canal. There is a stone-paved promenade and the old fashioned gas lamps are lit and provide a romantic atmosphere.
- ◆ **Sakaimachi Street** - Is an attractive, preserved merchant street in central Otaru, and famous with Kitaichi Glass and Music Box Museum.

### SAPPORO

- ◆ **Shiroyo Koibito Park** - Is a fantastic space based on the ideals of deliciousness, fun and stories of sweets from a bygone era. In addition to housing the Shiroyo Koibito Factory where this well-known Hokkaido confectionery is produced, the park also has a cafe to allow visitors to try Ishiya's original sweets, the Cookiecraft Studio, a toy exhibition room and the Rose Garden. The place visitors see, taste and experience here will make for truly "sweet" memories!
- ◆ **Hokkaido Shrine** - In 1869 the Meiji Emperor decided to enshrine three Shinto Deities: Sukunahikona, Ookunitama and Ookuninushi. They became the three deities of Hokkaido. The building for the shrine was built in 1871 and was called "Sapporo Shrine"
- ◆ **Okurayama Olympic Sky Jump** - It was used for ski jumping during the Winter Olympic Games in 1972.
- ◆ **The Former Hokkaido Government Building** - Is an American-neo-baroque structure constructed in 1888 as a base of the Hokkaido administration, It is the symbol of Hokkaido.
- ◆ **Tanukikoji Shopping Arcade** - Approximately 1KM- long arcade with around 200 shops that provide you a great shopping experience.
- ◆ **Mitsui Outlet Park** - The largest outlet park in Hokkaido Tohoku Area with a wide range of popular foreign and domestic brands available, including overseas luxury brands; ladies', men's and kids' fashions; sportswear & outdoor clothing; fashion accessories and household & interior goods.

## 观光景点:

### 登别

- ◆ **登别伊达时代村** - 游客可以回到300年前武士时代的仙台藩 (宫城县), 徜徉在仿古建筑街道, 与当时的忍者、花魁一同看花花世界。在伊达时代村, 游客在回顾一段美好的岁月, 又仿佛成为一出日本风情电影的演员, 欢声笑语, 真假难辨。
- ◆ **登别地狱谷** - 它是火山爆发后, 有融岩所形成的一个奇形诡异的谷地; 灰白和褐色的岩层加上许多地热自地低喷出, 形成特殊的火山地形景观, 所流出的泉水乃具有特殊疗效的温泉。
- ◆ **昭和新山** - 昭和初年所爆发的活火山, 故而得名。被归类为世界上罕见的岩塔型火山, 在红褐色的山脉中仍能见到地热白烟喷出。
- ◆ **登别海洋公园** - 是一座有着北欧城堡风格的海洋公园, 外观模仿耶斯克城堡为蓝图兴建, 内部以展示北方海洋生物为主。水晶塔里主要展出的是拿破仑鱼。漫步在水底隧道可以眺望周围穿梭来往的大小不一的各种鱼类, 简直就像在海底散步一样。此外还可以欣赏到可爱的企鹅游行 (视天气而定)。

### 小樽

- ◆ **小樽运河街** - 北海道的必访之地。建造於西元1914年开始建造, 但目前剩下可见的这一部分, 却成为小樽最为怀旧与浪漫的街景之一。
- ◆ **音乐风铃馆** - 本馆是音乐盒专卖店, 店里陈列展示及贩卖由世界各国收集, 共有3,000种以上精致的古董与现代的音乐盒, 目前在市面上几乎看不到的传统型音乐盒, 都可以在此看的到。

### 札幌

- ◆ **白色恋人巧克力城** - 北海道知名饼干“白色恋人”的生产工厂, 还可自费享用ISHIYA独家甜点的咖啡店。这里是以“美味、有趣、怀旧的甜点物语”为主题的一个充满梦想的空间。欣赏、品味、体验, 您的美好回忆点缀着甜蜜世界。
- ◆ **北海道神宫** - 明治二年明治天皇下令, 建造神宫来守护北海道, 成为名副其实的北海道守护神, 并将其供奉在现在的圆山之地。
- ◆ **大仓山跳跃台滑雪竞技场** - 1972(昭和47)年, 在札幌举办了冬季奥运会。作为当时的跳台滑雪竞技场, 大仓山为人们所熟知。
- ◆ **北海道道厅** - 北海道厅旧红砖厅舍是札幌的前政府大楼, 位于札幌市中心, 是一座用红砖建造的巴洛克风格的欧式建筑。
- ◆ **狸小路购物街** - 北海道最大的商店街, 除了历史悠久的老商店之外, 也有最近才开幕的新商店, 新旧店铺差排列在同一条街到, 让这条街独具魅力。
- ◆ **北广岛Mitsui Outlet购物城** - 北海道东北地区最大规模的奥特莱斯购物城。除海外奢侈品牌外, 从女装、男装、童装, 到运动&户外、时尚杂货、生活杂货, 国内外人气品牌全数集合。
